



ONESIE TEDDY

This fun teddy is wearing his Santa onesie and hat, ready for the big day! He's knitted in one piece, folded and then sewn together.

To make this project you will need:

Materials:

Double knitting wool - beige, red, black, white and green
Toy stuffing
Large black button for belt; three smaller red buttons for teddy's onesie
Small amount of wool to embroider the teddy's face - brown, black

Needles:

1 pair 4mm (UK 8; US 6) knitting needles

Instructions

Please note - this teddy is knitted in one piece with the fold at the top of his head.

Legs

Starting at the bottom of one leg, cast on 10 sts in black wool. Work in st st.

Row 1 - 6: knit in st st.

Row 7 - 20: change to red wool and continue in st st. Put these 10 sts onto a clip.

Cast on 10 sts in black wool and make a second leg in the same way as before.

Body, Arms and Head

Put both legs onto the same pair of needles with the knit side facing you.

Row 1 - 10: Knit across both legs using red wool. Continue in st st for 10 rows.

Row 11: cast on 6 sts in red (arm) and 4 sts in black (glove) at beg of the row, then k to the end of the row [30 sts].

Row 12: cast on 6 sts in red (arm) and 4 sts in black (glove) at beg of the row, then p to the end of the row [40 sts].

Row 13: k4 black, k32 red, k4 black.

Row 14: p4 black, p32 red, p4 black.

Row 15: *k4 black, k32 red, k4 black.*

Row 16: p4 black, p32 red, p4 black.*

Rows 17 - 20: Repeat rows 15 and 16 from * to * twice more.

Row 21: (Cast off 4 sts in black, 8 sts in red) (k16 red) (Cast off 8 sts red, 4 sts black).

Row 22: purl across row in red [16 sts].

Row 23: knit in red.

Row 24 - 32: change to beige wool and continue in st st for 9 rows.

Row 33: Cast on 2 sts at the beginning of the row, k to the end.

Row 34: Cast on 2 sts at the beginning of the row, p to the end [20 sts].

Row 35 - 38: st st.

You have now reached the top of the teddy. Continuing on the same stitches, following the pattern down the back

Row 39 - 42: st st.

Row 43: dec 2 sts at the beginning of the row, k to the end.

Row 44: dec 2 sts at the beginning of the

row, p to the end [16 sts].

Row 45 - 52: continue in st st for 8 rows.

Row 53: change to red wool and knit.

Row 54: purl in red.

Row 55: Cast on 8 sts in red and 4 sts in black at beg of row. k 4 black, k24 red.

Row 56: Cast on 8 sts in red (arm) and 4 sts in black (glove) at beg of row. p4 black, p32 red, p4 black [40 sts].

Row 57: *k4 black, k32 red, k4 black.

Row 58: p4 black, p32 red, p4 black.*

Row 59 - 64: Repeat from * to * three more times.

Row 65: Cast off 4 sts in black then 6 sts in red, knit in red to the last 10 sts. Cast off 6 sts in red, 4 sts in black [20 sts].

Row 66 - 74: Change to red wool and work in st st for 9 rows.

Split for the Legs

Work on the first 10 sts only, putting the last 10 sts on a clip.

Row 1 - 13: st st 13 rows in red wool.

Row 14 - 20: change to black wool and knit 7 rows in st st.

Cast off on a purl row and then repeat for the other leg using the stitches held on the clip.

Santa Hat

Cast on 30 sts in white wool.

Row 1 - 5: knit in garter stitch.

Row 6 - 17: change to red wool and work 12 rows in st st, starting with a knit row.

Row 18: (k2tog, k2) to the last 2 sts, k2 tog [22 sts].

Row 19: purl.

Row 20: (k2tog, k2) to last 2 sts. k2 tog [16 sts].

Row 21: (k2tog, k2) to end [12 sts].

Row 22 - 24: st st for 3 rows.

Row 25: (k2tog, k2) to end [9 sts].

Row 26 - 28: st st for 3 rows.

Row 29: (k2 tog, k1) to end [6 sts].

Row 30 - 32: st st for 3 rows.

Row 33: k2 tog to the end [3 sts].

Row 34: purl.

Row 35: k3tog.

Cut wool and pull through last stitch.

Scarf

Cast on 8 sts in green wool.

*Row 1 - 11: knit in garter stitch.

Row 12 - 22: change to white wool and continue in garter stitch for 11 rows. *

Continue working these 22 rows from * to * 5 more times or until the scarf fits around teddy's neck when tied in a loose knot. Cast off.

Belt

Cast on 4 sts in black wool.

Knit in st st until the belt fit comfortably around teddy's waist with a small overlap. Cast off.

Making a bobble

The bobble is made using cream wool.

Making up

On the wrong side of the knitting, fold the teddy in half at the top of his head. Sew around the teddy shape, leaving a gap for turning from the underarm down the side of her leg. Stitch slightly in at the corners of the gloves and boots to give a nice rounded shape. Stuff teddy and sew up the gap. Make two French knots for the teddy's eyes using brown wool, and a button nose and mouth in long stitch using black wool. Using cream wool, stitch across the corner of both ears to create a triangular shape. With red wool make a row of small gathering stitches around the neck edge of his onesie, pull up and then fasten the thread firmly to create the neck shape. Sew up the back seam of the hat on the wrong side of the knitting. Turn to the right side. Make a bobble and sew onto the point of the hat. Wrap the belt around teddy's waist. Overlap the ends and then sew together, adding a button at the point where they overlap. Sew three red buttons to the front of teddy's onesie.
